3. Major Activities (2026)

3.1 Skill Development Programs

Key training areas: Tailoring, Beauty Parlour, Computer (MS Office, internet, digital services), Employment-oriented (interview, communication, personality), and Self-Employment Guidance (business planning, loans, government schemes).

Impact:

- Increased employment and self-employment opportunities
- Women's economic empowerment improved
- Skill-based environment created at village level
- Reduction in unemployment

3.2 Biodiversity Conservation Programs

In 2026, Sevarth Foundation worked with around **200 Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs)**.

- Preparation of People's Biodiversity Registers — documentation of local biodiversity, traditional knowledge, medicinal plants
- Tree plantation and conservation — large-scale drives, fruit and medicinal plants, ongoing maintenance
- Protection of local biodiversity — species, water bodies, sustainable resource use
- Awareness — Gram Sabhas, schools, self-help groups, Environment & Biodiversity Day
- Capacity building — BMC training, Biodiversity Act 2002, Access and Benefit Sharing (ABS)

Impact: Strengthened biodiversity conservation in 200+ villages, documentation of local biodiversity, increased community awareness, and promotion of sustainable development.

3.3 Health Camps (Special Focus 2026)

Organized in collaboration with the **Integrated Tribal Development Project (ITDP)** in tribal areas of Nagpur district.

- Free health check-ups (height, weight, BP, diabetes)
- Healthcare for tribal students
- Identification and treatment of malnutrition
- Women's health guidance (maternal care, hygiene)
- Awareness on hygiene and nutrition

Impact: Hundreds of beneficiaries received free healthcare; early disease detection; greater awareness among women; improved hygiene practices.
